Did you know that a single stroke of lightning could have 125,000,000 volts of electricity? About 2,000 people are killed worldwide by lightning each year. The monsoon season is upon us, use these tips to help stay safe.

SAFETY TIPS: LIGHTNING STRIKES

If you are outdoors, seek shelter as soon as possible.

Stay away from anything that could conduct electricity.

If your hair stands on end or your skin tingles – lightning may be about to strike you. Crouch down with your feet close together. Keep your hands on your knees and lower your head. Do NOT lie down!

Stay off or away from anything tall; trees, rooftops, scaffolding, utility poles and ladders.

If you're traveling, stay in your vehicle and roll up the windows.

When someone is struck by lightning, get emergency medical help as soon as possible. Often the person can be revived with CPR. Start CPR immediately.

AC/DC (no, we are not talking about the rock band), are different types of electrical currents that can be deadly. Here are some safety tips to help you stay safe when working with them.

SAFETY TIPS: AC vs. DC

Alternating current (AC) is most common at construction sites and within the home as it can be transformed to lower voltages and transported long distances with minimal interruptions in power.

Direct current (DC) travels in one direction and is produced by sources such as batteries and solar cells.

Both AC and DC can be deadly. Any voltage is considered to be capable of delivering dangerous amounts of current.

The actual measure of the shocks intensity is within the amount of current, in milli-amperes, that is forced through the body.

Always be cautious when you are working with or around electricity of any voltage, at home or on the job.

Use ground-fault circuit interrupters (GFCI) protection and follow your employers assured equipment grounding program at each job site that involves electricity.
